
We hope and pray as you learn more about Christ Central Church that you will keep us in your prayers, consider financially supporting our mission, and possibly even consider joining our team.

### **LOCATION**


### Pittsburgh, PA







Pittsburgh population that identify as Catholic




1 SBC church: per every 45,000 people







# Target Area: Northside

### 3 Reasons for planting on the Northside

- **Neighborhood**. Ethnic and cultural diverse area, yet only 1-2 diverse churches.
- **Next-Gen**. With close proximity to several colleges, there is a great potential to raise up future ministry leaders.
- **Nations**. With many internationals moving in, there are few churches and (0) SBC churches reaching them in our target location.

#### • The Neighborhood


The Northside is home to the Steelers & Pirates, Allegheny Commons Park, Andy Warhol Museum, Children's Museum and Nova Place. Here, affluent communities like the Mexican War Streets neighbor communities, such as, Manchester making a truly diverse place. Sadly, there has has never been an SBC church planted in this community with roughly 40,000 plus residents. We believe that this is an opportunity to intentionally plant a church that seek's to reflect the diversity in its community. We will engage our target area by asking good questions and listening to the cities' story as we seek to share, serve, and live out the hope of the gospel. Our hope is to point individuals, families, and our community to a better bridge and a greater mediator — Jesus Christ.

#### • The Next Generation

With greater than 80,000 college students in the city center there is a great opportunity to shape the next generation. Within a two mile radius from our target area are 30,000 college students that we hope to reach in a tangible way. The Community College of Allegheny (CCAC) has one of the largest student populations, second only to the University of Pittsburgh. We will seek to open our homes, share meals, and do life with students over span of their college years and beyond.

#### • The Nations

According to the U.S. Census Bureau by year 2043, America will be a majority minority nation. From the 90 different communities that make up Pittsburgh, the nations are truly here and are moving in. When comparing Pittsburgh metro to the city center, one quickly sees that the city is almost 20% more diverse than Pittsburgh metro. In our target area you will find people from Lebanon, Pakistan, Syria, India, South Korea, China, India, Japan and France. We will be committed to prayer as we seek to learn about our neighbors and their cultures in order to practice intentional neighbor love with those near and far from God. Our hope is to be a church in the neighborhood reaching the nations.

Scattering


Christ Central will *scatter* throughout the week to *care* for one another in loving *community*. Our hope is to live not like family but as family.

Outreach



Multiplying


Christ Central will *reach far* by committing to church planting. Our hope is to spark a movement by investing, training, and coaching future leaders to be sent out both locally and globally.



## **BUDGET**



Pittsburgh, PA is consistently ranked one of the the most affordable cities to live in the U.S. according to *The Economist*. Yet, doing ministry in the urban core is still expensive. Therefore, we are seeking to raise \$160,000.00 annually in order to compensate for staff, renting space, purchasing start-up equipment, and still have funds left over for ministry and mission work. *Join us as we ask both individuals and churches to partner with us financially for three years in prayerful expectation that by our fourth year, Christ Central Church will be primarily supported internally through the faithful giving of our members.*


